

I gave that permission for overnight only. you have continued to stay during the day in a manner that has obstructed the conduct of business and violated the University Conduct Code at The Law

Yesterday I asked you to leave this building and ~~you~~ told you that ~~you~~

you would be breaking the law by remaining without permission. However, I <sup>extended</sup> ~~gave~~ you permission <sup>for you</sup> to remain ~~overnight~~ <sup>overnight in the lobby</sup> after you ~~assured~~ <sup>pledged that</sup> your actions

would remain non-violent. I ~~permitted~~ <sup>I recognized your sense of frustration and anguish over the war in Vietnam, and I recognize the</sup> this because I ~~know~~ <sup>know</sup> that staying in the building overnight was of great <sup>symbolic importance of that situation</sup> symbolic importance to you, But I told as I said ~~to~~ <sup>to</sup> you <sup>last night</sup> that your specific demands ~~were~~ <sup>are</sup> beyond my power to grant and thus your stay ~~was~~ <sup>could</sup> only symbolic.

I am charged with the responsibility of seeing that the authorized operations of this University are carried out with <sup>out</sup> interference or disruption.

As ~~our Distinguished Professor of Law~~ <sup>and officer</sup> Orlando Hollis, told you last night, the gathering of such a large number of people ~~was~~ in the corridors of this building, even though well-intentioned and based on protestations of non-violence, is coercive and disruptive. It interferes with the adequate functioning of the University and creates ~~an~~ <sup>again</sup> tension and anxiety. I ask you now, ~~again~~ <sup>again</sup>, to leave this building peacefully.

~~I inform you that~~ <sup>and</sup>, by staying in this ~~building~~ <sup>out</sup> without permission, you are violating the ordinances of ~~the~~ Eugene, ~~and~~ the laws of the state, and ~~you are also violating~~ the University's Code of Student Conduct <sup>which the</sup> ~~student body and the campus community generally have formulated with~~ ~~great pride to administer~~ ~~our own affairs~~. If you continue to stay in the building, therefore, you will be subject to <sup>arrest and</sup> ~~prosecution~~ <sup>seeking</sup>.

The Attorney General has advised me that ~~an~~ <sup>an</sup> injunction ~~is~~ <sup>is</sup> would not be suitable under these circumstances. Our Student Conduct Code, which the student body and the campus community have carefully formulated, is not ~~designed~~ <sup>designed</sup> to handle ~~such~~ <sup>expeditiously</sup> matters ~~involving~~ <sup>involving</sup> such large numbers of people. Your actions, therefore, strike at the foundations of ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> Code and place it in jeopardy, thus threatening ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> welfare of your fellow students.

You can be held for permission for any breach of the law since you entered the building.
