From 1,200 to 1,500 at the meeting when the strike vote was taken. Two-thirds voted for the strike, with approximately 50 opposed. The strike is against "business as usual" at the University.

There is no terminal ~~minimum~~ date for the strike - it is open-ended.

Eachus:

(after reading President's statement):

What this means is that there is no longer any necessity to continue the normal activities of this University. I believe we should go on record as supporting the strike against the normal activities of this campus, in this community and in this nation. We may not agree on what action to take, but we should be able to agree on taking some action.

Some classes will be going on, but there is no reason why these classes every day should not be ~~confronted~~ confronted with these grave national issues.
