New York computer being held by students sold back to city for \$50,000.

Brandeis Univ. -- Reports 410 colleges on strike.

Univ. of Washington - 10,000 anti-war demonstrators marching in Seattle.

New York Construction workers - attacked 12 anti-war demonstrators and bloodied them. Lindsay orders flags at half-mast. Workers want them at full-mast.

All New York schools are closed.

Amey - toning down his statements, called demonstrators "choleric young intellectuals, older demonstrators, tired, embittered elders." He also called Senator Fulbright, "...boldest, most reactionary plea for isolationism since WW II."

Eight University Presidents said Thursday after conferring with President Nixon, that he has assured them that his administration would cease making hostile criticism of the academic community.

The Army said today it is considering court martial of five soldiers who refused to go to Cambodia.

Univ. of Buffalo - at least four youths hit by birdshot - 60 officers and 400 students had a tear gas, rock-throwing melee.

Carbondale, Ill. - National Guardsmen hurled tear gas and advanced with fixed bayonets to rout large bands of students.

Univ. of Wisconsin - 40 -- 45 blazes blazes.

Lacquette U. - \$7,000 damage by fire bombing to the Administration Building.

Univ. of Minnesota - \$300 damage to ROTC -- AFROTC.

Univ. of Washington - bands of youths blocking streets, rock throwing, - town vigilantes wandering around with clubs; and chemical sprays.

Univ. of Bridgeport, Conn. - students are presently occupying four buildings.

Southern Oregon College - Student Body President's life threatened, National Rifle Association announced they would start shooting demonstrators if flag wasn't raised back to top.

Washington D.C. - 100,000 students expected at Saturday rally.

Interstate 90 - coast to coast protest along Interstate 90 - Sat. May 9th.

Larkely - 1200 draft cards turned in.

UCSD - 200 draft cards turned in.

State of Vermont - every school closed with the exception of a military academy.

Florida State Univ. - 300 people in ROTC before police arrived, 200 - 300 in administration building before police arrived.

Univ. of Texas - 10,000 on strike; 5 arrests.

Univ. of Kentucky - ROTC building burned; 5 arrests.

St. Louis Teachers - on strike for wages - discussing joining students.

Whittier - tents pitched on campus; demonstration in form of a sit in.

USC - Schools of Medicine, Architecture, and Law closed for rest of year.
