The ASUO Senate, student mx governing body of the University of Oregon, voted to withdraw its magnetic support of the student strike at a meeting this evening.

Recognizing the need to continue discussion of the issues which resulted in recent disturbances. the Remain Student Senate passed a motion endorsing a University-wide assembly to be held as soon as arrangements can be made, and that teach-ins be conducted until that am assembly can be convened. The group also recommended that President Robert D. Clark cancel classes dering the xessembly xx for the hours that the assembly is scheduled.

During Senate debate one Senator, Bernis Corrigan, a graduate student in psychology, said he and some of his associates had conducted a poll of University students over the weekend. Results of the poll showed that 71 per cent of University students did not support the strike. He said only 39 per cent of the strike supporters indicated they would boycott classes. Fifty eight per cent of those polled felt that the police should not have been called
