Events scheduled at the University of Oregon April 21-24, as part of a nation-wide teach-in on problems of the environment, were announced Friday morning by Bob Greene, administrative assistant of the Associated Students of the University of Oregon.

The teach-in, called "Time Out for Survival", is sponsored by the ASUO Survival Center.

The idea of an environmental teach-in originated with several U.S. senators.

Students at some 3,000 high schools and 1,000 colleges across the country are expected to participate.
