SIGNIFICANCE STATEMENT:

This house was razed to build Marion Hall. It was one of only six known houses by Lawrence or his firms in Eugene, and the only one to be demolished. It and the S.H. Friendly House were the most visible of these houses, both being located on important 11th Street. The Wetherbee House was near the still-existing Alpha Phi Sorority and Sigma Nu Fraternity houses, also by Lawrence. Frank Wetherbee came to Eugene in 1895 and became co-owner of the Cockerline & Wetherbee Store in 1902. In 1920 he began the Wetherbee-Walker Furniture Co. (later Wetherbee-Powers), which Lawrence altered in 1923.




