liability to Mr Prot & Eddy expect-  
ing you were an honest man  
but have been very much deceived  
unless you do something more respec-  
table than you have yet done.  
I wrote you 6 or 6 months ago  
reasoning with you and offering  
if you would let me have the  
same amount of money for the same  
time you have had mine without  
interest I would be satisfied but  
you paid no attention to it I  
mention this thinking it possible
