

Wishes etc & present with my regards
to Mr. Bled at Belmont especially
and myself at Pepper and Puttner 2^o 25 May 15th 1856.

Desiring you to make a list of
articles & have directed Mr. Metcalf to
turn over to you all the public property
in his hands - not required for such service
as he is engaged in. You will except
to him for such articles as may be turned
over being particular and enumerating
each article - and see orange the memorandum
as to enable you to know precisely every article
turning himself to the government -

You will then suffer charge of the entire
belongings of that agency - turning over to
the respective Mechanics and forming the
tools & which they may require for
efficiency - desirous taking their receipts for
the same - all property should be called
over and an inventory of each article found
out to the respective employees to be seen
that you can stand at any time in whose
hands the ~~same~~ ^{same may be} vehicle may be
placed - any property not required for the use
of the respective Mechanics given - Paid the
superintendent of police - teachers &c you will
see by returns in your custody - and may

It only for the benefit of the service
each employee should be held to a
strict accountability and required to perform
the services for which he may have been
engaged - and a failure so far as should
be reported to the super office with the facts
connected therewith.

This will be in the sense the following

are placed in with the Willamette Licks

Levitt (working in stores along with Willamette

Or what ever may be required, getting materials, de-
signing equipment for supplies - and one for
Rubber mines - and two computers for
the agency - The Plessiter will be placed
a hospital street. The super power operates
five Willamette Licks will be placed to supply
and burn coal his control from Indiana

and cost of the other pews will be added thereto
and the contributions for the same
will be at least 150 per day - costs, suits,
~~time~~ and expenses will be added to those
above ~~expenses~~ are paid by, until the time
two costs are to be deducted and rationed
at the expense of the Indian to which he belongs
the articles being furnished by the person in whose
charge they are on the approval of the agent,
and at the end of each quarter obtaining a copy
of the head chief of the tribe for the article furnished.

The salary of Indian employees to be paid
out of the amount paid for whose benefit they
are laboring. There will be an expense
and one agent occupying a master agency
and his duty will be to receive and ration
all the provisions in accordance with instructions
of the agent. The Indians who are engaged in
labor for themselves are employed in the pews
or else when will need as a ration one large
plum one large puff of fresh soap an 3/4 lb salt
meat ~~the day~~ grits two bushels sugar 8 lbs
rice and 2 quarts salt in the proportion of 8 lbs
copper an 8 lbs tea two twists 100 natus. Those who
do not labor will receive and be placed under
a sack wool and no sugar or copper - but salt

as in other cases - all above the age of 12 years over
to be considered as entitled to full ratios - below
the age ^{1/2} the proportion to size of the child -
and fees, tools & money required will be ~~fixed~~
^{in charge of the agent} and the respective persons, and they will be
entitled to such reasonable proportion of fees as will be
in proportion to the size of the child - The child in the agent's
office will receive from the Agent back a copy
of each treaty under which employees are
in service to the agent in charge -
The agent will instruct the Indians to select
a tract of land upon which to erect his dwelling
and commence cultivating the soil - and when
tract is designated ~~for~~ will be
substantially set out and kept open for publick
use in conjunction with other lands the
agent and friends - but each tract designated
before regarded as permanent shall be appurtenant
to the agent's office - but temporary locations
may be agreed by the agent and agent, and fees
as above - It will be the duty of the fees,
to open each Indian who wishes to cultivate the soil
in selecting suitable ground, in erecting his dwelling
in making his fence, cultivating his land & to
denote his services & labor to the benefit of
the tribe for whom he is employed - to secure the

cultivation of crops for the joint benefit of
old & young - and indigo persons, by means
of his own labour and contribution of the
members of the tribe generally in proportion to
their ability to labour - explaining to them
the necessity of this as a ~~contingent~~ resort
not injury individual actions or the general
support from their respective families.

The agent will assist in plowing the fields
in preparing the tools and have a general super-
vision of the forces about me.

The carpenters for the respective tribes will assist
in erecting their houses and their furniture and
do all that may be required to promote the
general welfare and prosperity of other tribes.
The smiths and tins will listen the snakes
exclusively to the wants of the tribes upon
the reservation - and shall furnish to the
agent individual needs necessary to them in their line
and upon the responsibility of the agent in charge - in
such articles as may be required by the Indians
and furnish the same.

The agent in charge will have a general
supervision over all the tribe departments and the
state park person papers faithfully his best

monthly reports will be made by him to the diff
officers - giving in detail the condition of the army
and navy of the Philippines - the manner in which they
discharge their duties - amount of labor performed
improvements made - health of the people &c
etc. There will be one school teacher for the
Philippines Islands and one for the Philippines

have the direction of these schools & selection
of books &c and make representations upon the
agent for such clothing as may be necessary to
comfortably ~~and decently~~ cloth the pupils

They shall also such awards for merit
in the schools as will inspire attachment, and ~~distract~~
~~present~~ ~~in luxury the day~~ ~~and distract~~ ~~the~~ attend school

At the end of each month a settlement will
be made with contractors for supplies of beef
and flour and the agent in charge will give
a certificate for the amount furnished.

The agent will settle with and pay for
all Indian labor performed on the reservation
but mechanics, pavers and railroad employees
will be paid at the superintendent's office upon
a certificate of the agent showing the time of service
date of payment and money and date of pay
receipts for supplies will be made on the

and forwarded to meet the ~~importunity~~ ~~importunity~~ of the
Dept's office in time ~~to be paid for~~
articles needed. The person contracted with
to meet bookings; the place land &c will be required
to perform faithfully and in a workmanlike manner what
they have been agreed upon and it is the duty of the
agent in charge to supervise such work - giving
a certificate of service &c

The manager will superintend
in advance to be supplied fit for use - and perform
whatever duties may be required in his time, making an
allowing wages plus bonus, &c &c

The Merchant, manager, and other persons having
charge of my branch of business will report to the
agent the condition of the respective ~~branch~~ ~~branch~~
departments, monthly.

After inspection, when there may be
found damages or deficit will be given subsequently
