

Information in support of Wmshs 84. 29^d 1854
" Wmshs 84 Estate of P. G. Thompson late & at
such agent entry fee for 40 days \$ 80.23"

I have the call your attention to my application
of this Wmshs forwarded by Letter under date of
30th, May 1855. And add that there was
an absolute necessity for sending an
agent into the Yamhill district. The limit
Salary of 750\$ per annum then allowed would
not Mr. Thompson contend justify him
in qualifying and attending to the duties
in that district. And if insisted upon
he would decline to accept of the appointment.

It was an interim station and had been
occupied as as a full agency district.

Mr. M. M. Thompson who had been appointed
a full agent had not yet come in the
country. and as I had designed
carrying P. G. Thompson to the Willamette
district in which he resided - he consented
at my earnest solicitation to go into the
W. Multnomah and Columbia county until
the full agent should come, by being
allowed the rate of agents salary during the
time he was in that district. I do not but
regard the additional consideration under the circumstances
as being equitable as it was really insufficient to
remunerate him for additional outlays above
those if he had remained in the district to be apportioned
