Dear Sir,

I almost despair

I am yet ignorant whether you
have rec^d any of the vouchers, taken
by me & regularly forwarded; I

the Territory, for Supplies furnished
the Volunteers at Rogue River during
the war - and lastly, I have forwarded
to Portland, the balance of the Co's
which was \$170.⁷⁵ /¹⁰⁰ Have you got them

that S. B. Blake of P. R. - is very impudent
about the sein & thinking of another,
by the late Rev. Wright; - write me, what's
the news generally -

I am alone at the Fort; occupy
the old Quarters - left in charge of
the Reservation, which I occupy alone,
cook for myself, eat my bread with
thankfulness, and "Simpleness" of heart,
give my regards to friends
