Wright which was killed by some person or persons in the summer of 1857 whilst in the service of Benjamin Wright special Indian agent - and whether the time at the time it was killed ~~was~~ <sup>was</sup> in the service of the Indian department - and whether the killing was in consequence of that service" ~~Please do state~~ - But a man by the if so, please state what kind of service the agent was engaged in that made it necessary <sup>in my knowledge</sup> to employ a horse - and all the circumstances attending the same" &c

The facts as I understand them are as follows  
A man by the name of Irish was charged, and  
it was generally believed guilty of furnishing the  
<sup>along the coast at and near the mouth of the River</sup> Indians with guns, Ammunition, and liquor,  
along the coast about the mouth of the river  
Dionis and between that point and Port Oxford  
complaint was made to the magistrate the special  
agent - and he proceeded to the mouth of the river  
Rivine where he arrested Mr. Irish, and whilst on  
his way with him to Port Oxford in the  
Justice's office in the night time whilst  
at ~~the~~ <sup>These</sup> a point called the 3 Sisters or butts  
on the coast the Prisoner made his escape.

The magistrate made diligent search for him for  
several days and finally employed two Indians  
chiefs at first offered to aid him - they finally  
got through of his whereabouts in the vicinity of Port  
Oxford as he was about to leave the neighbourhood,  
these ~~two~~ <sup>two</sup> Indians were put out as this - the magistrate turned  
and one belonging to one of the Indians were ~~put~~ <sup>turned</sup>  
out <sup>to graze</sup> near the coast above the Lagoon some <sup>or 3</sup> miles  
from Port Oxford - In the night this horse
