U.S. OLYMPIC TRACK AND FIELD TRIALS

EUGENE, OREGON - JUNE 29 - JULY 9, 1972

800 METERS

The runners went out fast in the final with Tom Fulton the early leader. The field rushed by Fulton at the head of the final backstretch and Ryan took command looking strong. Wottle moved from last place on the final turn and burned by Ryan in the straight. Ryan faded in front of the tape to finish fourth. Wottle's time (1:44.3) equaled the world record and set a new American record.

Robert F. Giegenack is head track coach at Yale University and Chairman of the United States Olympic Track and Field Committee. He has coached track at Yale for 23 years and is a magna cum laude graduate of Holy Cross.

Giegenack has a highly successful coaching record and, among many other honors, was the head Olympic coach for the track and field team that dominated the games in Tokyo in 1964. He is a member of the NCAA rules committee, co-chairman of the national track and field committee of the

AAU and was recently elected to the Board of Directors of the U.S. Olympic Committee.

Program Information

Because the entry deadline for athletes competing in the Olympic Trials was set only a few days before the event, it was necessary to print the program without the names of athletes in each event. A supplement to the program will carry this information and the names can be entered in the lines provided on each event page in the program.

Each day of the Trials, the Oregon Daily Emerald (the campus newspaper) will print a sports special that will carry participant information and late arrivals so that this information can also be transferred to the official program.

The three top athletes in each event will comprise the official U.S. Olympic Team. Space has been provided on each event page to enter those names with their winning results.

U.S. Olympic Coaches



Hoover Wright has a rich background in coaching as well as athletic administration, having served as Athletic Director at Paul Quinn College as well as coach of the football, basketball and track teams. After moving to Prairie View A & M College in 1966, Wright became both head football coach and head track coach. At Prairie View he has never finished worse than third in his conference in track and field. Hoover Wright has received many honors for his outstanding coaching talents (1970 Coach of the Year—N.A.A.) and serves on a number of national track committees including the U.S. Olympic Track and Field Committee and the Track and Field Committee of the A.A.U.



Bill McClure became track coach at the University of South Carolina this year after eight highly successful years at Abilene Christian College. While at Abilene, he led the Wildcats to 22 major titles. His teams have won the Southland Conference seven of his eight years of coaching. McClure holds many national positions in track and field including his responsibilities as NCAA representative to the U.S. Olympic Games Committee. He also sits on the U.S. Track Coaches Executive Committee. McClure is a 1948 graduate of Abilene Christian with a master's from Hardin-Simmons.

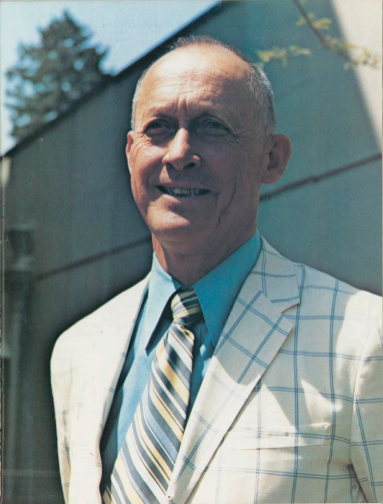


Stan Wright is an internationally-known coach of track and field now in his fourth year at Sacramento State. In his 20 years of coaching track, Wright has produced some of the quickest sprint and relay teams in the world. In his 16 years at Texas Southern, his teams won nine league championships and never finished lower than third in the conference. Many honors have come to Stan Wright in his coaching career and serving as an Olympic coach is not a new experience to him. He coached the U.S. sprinters in the 1968 Olympics.



Ted Hayden is not a new-comer to Olympic coaching. He served as a coach on the U.S. team at Mexico City in 1968 and he is currently a member of the U.S. Olympic Committee. Hayden is a native of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan and has coached at the University of Chicago since 1950. In his first year at Chicago he started the now famous University of Chicago Track Club as an informal organization providing year-round opportunity for graduate athletes to compete on the amateur level. Hayden was chairman for track and field for the 1959 Pan American Games held in Chicago and has served as coach or assistant coach on several U.S. teams that have traveled abroad.

Bill Bowerman's roots are deep in his native state of Oregon. His father once served as Governor of the state and Bowerman was raised in southern Oregon. The University of Oregon, where he is head track coach and assistant athletic director, is also his Alma Mater. Bowerman has built on the tradition of track and field established at Oregon by Col. Bill Hayward, and expanded it to a program that enjoys international recognition for excellence. Bill Bowerman has coached more sub-four minute miles than any other man in the world. He has been active nationally in track and field organizations and his appointment as head coach for the U.S. Olympic Team is a great tribute to his lifetime of contributions to the sport.

In the spring of 1949, Bill Bowerman, the newly appointed track coach of the University of Oregon, got an idea that something should be done to stimulate interest in track and field during the summer months. So he held an all-comers meet for grade school athletes. Fifteen people showed up.

The next summer he held an all-comers meet for high school seniors and college-age athletes. Twenty people showed up.

The next year an old friend and colleague from Medford High School was on the scene. Bob Newland had taken the job as track coach at North Eugene High School and, along with Bowerman and a few other interested track fans, founded an organization they called the "Emerald Empire Athletic Association."

The goals of this association were threefold—(1) to promote a youth program for youngsters in track and field, (2) to provide training assistance and facilities for track and field athletes of all ages, and (3) to sponsor one big track meet each summer as a fund raising event to support the other programs. The Emerald Empire Athletic Association sponsored the state of Oregon AAU Championships that summer and an ambitious young organization of working track enthusiasts was born.

Because of the role they were playing in both national

and international competition, it became obvious that the name of the club should identify its location. And so the switch to "Oregon Track Club."

While the dues paying membership has grown to about 500 dedicated track fans (including governors, senators, mayors and other dignitaries), the objectives remain the same. The all-comers meet that once drew 15 to 20 competitors now accommodates 400 to 500 participants in each of the five weekends after the 4th of July. Because of the growth of the program, there are now eight classifications for both boys and girls—up to six, seven to eight, nine to ten, 11 to 12, 13 to 14, 15 to 16, 17 to 18 and open above 18.

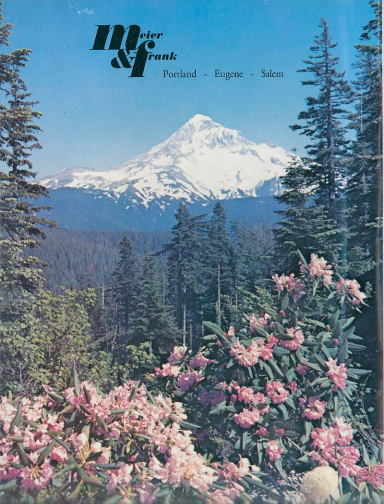
The OTC is attempting to do more for the graduate athletes who are competing nationally and internationally. Adequate financing is a constant problem, but with the growing membership and growing success of the summer meet it appears that more help will be possible for the senior athletes.

The summer twilight meets in recent years have grown to the point where they fill the stands at Hayward Field to capacity.
