

Wintle Creek April 13th 1854, The following
information has been received from, Sam, and his
Sister, Mother, and an other Squaw.
Lie Jim, Chief of a Rogue River Band of Indians, came to
their camp on the head of Rogue River, on pursuit of
some Indians who had been charged with killing boys
belonging to the Whites, some ten days previous to Sam's
arrival at their camp, a Rogue River Indian came to
their camp who proved to be the Indian that had done
the mischief, and Lie Jim took the Indian and
took him and shot the husbands of Sam's Sister,
and took two Rifles. — One bundle of Quaws for
taken deers —
