affairs for the Territory of Oregon

The undersigned
Inhabitants of Applegate creek & branches feeling
disappointed in having the Indians remain on this
creek contrary to our expectation & the stipulations of
the late Treaty & much to our damage we living
not sufficiently compact for self protection we live
in constant fear for our families ourselves & our property
we don't feel warranted in making permanent improvements
which we desire to do the early settlers have suffered
quite to much in the past from the depredations of the Indians
on this creek this season twenty or more farming claims
have been made & many more wishing to settle in this
families are not considered safe in open day
our gardens robbed as soon as before matured our
horses road & spoiled &c were it not for ^{the} watchfulness
& oft repeated councils of the present agent it would
be impossible for us to remain in peace the undersigned
believe this to be a true representation of facts as they now
exist we beg leave to call your early attention to their
removal & save us the necessity of protecting ourselves
