Genl Palmer

Sir I recd yours of the 17th inst
in relation to Indian Peter's acct against
W Lucier and would say that I have not
seen Lucier but called upon his brother
-in-law who informed me that Lucier refused
any further payments stating that he had
paid Peter \$5. My impression is that
the Frenchman is indebted to Peter \$33.25-
but will deny the acct without any prospect
of establishing the same by proof. I give
this note to Peter to satisfy him until
something further can be learned in
reference to his difficulty.
