

June 4th 1855 Coosue County O. T.

At a meeting of the citizens held at the House of Mr. H. Packwood, this day, the following resolutions was unanimously adopted, Jas. G. Malcolm was called to the chair, and John B. Gulley appointed Secretary.

Whereas, the ^{of Indians} Klickatite tribe, came in this Country last Summer, and killed a great number of Elk for their skins, and are in the habit of trading Fire-arms & ammunition to the Indians on this river abusing the settlers to them telling them they are "Cultus tilacoom" - have taken their ^{skins} from them for nothing, and treating bad feelings among these Indians generally against the settlers also they have told these Indians they intend to come back this Summer and kill all the Elk they can find in spite of the white people on this river.

Resolved that

Who as we the settlers in this Valley derive our principal meat from the game in this Country we will inform the Superintendent of Indian Affairs in regard to the Klickatite Indians, conduct while in this portion of the Country, requesting him to keep and forbid them from ^{coming} there again on any pretence whatever.

I Resolved, that if they the Klickatite tribe of Indians are not kept away from this Valley by the proper authorities that we will if necessary resort to arms and expel them by force - that if any more of them are ~~known~~ to trade or sell fire arms or ammunition to the Indians on this river we will take and punish them as we think fit, and proper.

14th Resolved that the Superintendent of Indian Affairs in Oregon is hereby notified that there has never been any treaty made with these Indians, also that they have never been visited by either agents or Sub-agents of the Indian Department,

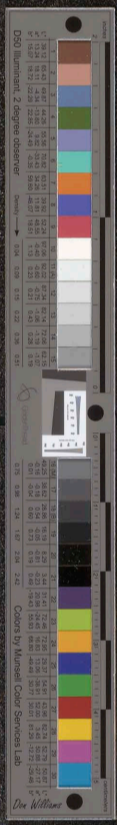
