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ETHIOPIA'S ALLEGATIONS ON NILE WATERS REJECTEL

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[Unattributed report: "Egypt Rejects Ethiopian Memo on Nile Waters"]

[Text] The Arab Republic of Egypt has declared its rejection of Ethiopia's
 false allegations regarding Egypt's utilization of the Nile waters. Egypt
 considers these allegations an attempt to interfere in its internal affairs
 and as absolutely contrary to the principles of the world community and the
 OAU.

Minister of State for Foreign Affairs Dr Butrus Ghali said that a memorandum
 to this effect was delivered to the Ethiopian ambassador in Cairo and to
 the OAU in reply to a memorandum by the Ethiopian Government to the OAU.

Ghali said that in its memorandum Egypt has stressed its full right to
 utilize its allotted share of the Nile waters in a manner which serves its
 interests and in accordance with the international agreements defining the
 distribution and the utilization of the Nile waters. Egypt has also sub-
 stantiated its answer with historical facts that prove that the use of the
 Nile waters in the Sinai Peninsula is an absolute and unquestionable
 Egyptian right.

Dr Butrus Chali said that Egypt has made it clear in its memorandum that
 while it is fully fulfilling its commitments in accordance with the inter-
 national laws and agreements on the Nile waters, it adheres to the need for
 the source countries to strictly comply with the laws and agreements govern-
 ing the established rights of the countries through which the river flows.

The minister of state for foreign affairs said that, in its memorandum,
 Egypt has called for cooperation among the Nilotic countries so as to
 achieve the ideal utilization of the Nile waters for the benefit of all
 the countries concerned.

Foreign under secretary, Ambassador Samir Ahmad handed this memorandum to
 the Ethiopian ambassador. The memorandum will also be distributed among
 the OAU countries.
