**Ozal Inaugurates Karakaya Hydropower Plant**

[Text] Diyarbakir (A.A.) — Premier Turgut Ozal who started his visit to Southeast Anatolian Project (GAP) today said that the bad faith of the east and southeast Anatolian regions will be reversed with the dams within the scope of the project.

Premier Turgut Ozal opened into service the first and second units of the Karakaya hydraulic power plant and dam on the Euphrates River. Stressing that the bad faith of the region will be overcome with the Ataturk and Karakaya Dams, Premier Ozal said that the amount of energy presently generated was ten fold of the amount produced at the 1950's.

During his 4-day GAP visit, Premier Ozal is accompanied by his wife, five ministers, 26 deputies, 15 businessmen, 61 press members and 27 public employees.

**More Policemen to Southeast Region**

[Excerpt] Prime Minister Turgut Ozal has said that more policemen will be stationed in the southeastern Anatolian region, adding that these forces will be equipped with modern weapons. Speaking at the inauguration of the new Adiyaman Security Directorate building, Ozal said that due to the increase in the number of residents in urban areas, the policemen's tasks have also increased.

Pointing out that efforts have been and will continue to be made in a bid to improve the policemen's salaries within the capacities of the state and to improve their weaponry, Ozal said: We will make more use of police teams in this area, providing them with the necessary weapons for the task.

Speaking at the same ceremony, Interior Minister Yildirim Akbulut recalled that on the whole peace and order have been ensured in the country, though now and then grievous incidents do occur in this particular area. He promised that this situation will also be remedied.

Turkish Radio and Television correspondents Ahmet Cetingil and Mevlut Akin report that Akbulut said the sources of unrest will be eliminated through economic measures, and certain problems will thus be solved. [passage omitted]

**'Separatist Terrorist' Killed in Armed Clash**

[Text] Semdinli (A.A.) — One terrorist was caught and the other was killed in a clash between security forces and the separatist gangs today in a southeastern village where the insurgents attempted to raid, officials said.

Officials told AA that a group of separatist terrorists who attempted to raid early this morning Tutunlu village of Semdinli and village guards entered an armed clash. The security forces

who were informed of the incident through the wireless surrounded the separatist terrorists.

At the end of the half-an-hour clash, one separatist was shot dead and the other one was caught alive, officials added. The separatist terrorist caught in the clash was identified as Vahit Erdem, who is known to conceive the bloody attacks in the area of Semdinli.

**Villagers Kidnapped**

[Text] Uludere (A.A.) — Separatist terrorists who raided a high plateau of southeastern Hakkari's Uludere township kidnapped 15 people Wednesday.

Officials said Thursday that separatist terrorists who raided a plateau near the Akduman village kidnapped 15 young people who were staying in a tent.

Officials who started operations in the region are also trying to identify those kidnapped by terrorists.

The number of persons kidnapped by separatist terrorists in the mountainous area of southeastern city Hakkari during the last two months reached 66.

Officials said that the separatist terrorists, who did not receive support from the people in the region, eventually started kidnapping people so as to force villagers to join them.

**Spokesman About End to Syrian-Based Terrorists**

[Text] Ankara (A.A.) — The Turkish Foreign Ministry said today, despite the official guarantee of Syria, Turkey is cautious whether the terrorists actions, which might be initiated from the Syrian land, are completely ended.

Foreign Ministry's Deputy Spokesman Nazim Belger commented today on press reports that "a terrorist who surrendered to security forces confessed that he came from Syria."

Stressing that Turkey has repeatedly expressed her sensitivity on the issue to Syrian authorities Nazim Belger said "we believe that Syria has not overlooked our rightful sensitivity on the issue and took some measures to control terrorist actions."

However, he added, "we are watching closely whether the terrorist actions which might be initiated from the Syrian soil are completely stopped."
