AMMAN -- The Ministry of Agriculture's main task is not restricted only to agricultural production, tather its responsibilities are extend far beyond to include planning agricultural production, conducting research to expand markets and offering agricultural education in order to increase farmers awareness about proper farm methods. Minister of Agriculture Mohammad Al Bashir said Thursday during a meeting held at the University of Jordan Addressing over 500 agr

cultural engineers, veterinarians and administrators from the Min-istry of Agriculture, Mr. Bashir outlined the problems facing the ministry and stressed the need to amend the agricultural law and the bylaws of the ministry in accordance with the new reqorements and goals of the min-

Since the Ministry of Agrtenture is facing a deficit in its budget this year, the minister cal-led for a new policy to economise he spending of all sectors and ties lds of agriculture.

"If an efficient administration is

"If an efficient administration is provided this year, we can manage to work smoothly within the limited potentials that we have," the minister said.

The Ministry of Agriculture started its economising policy this year and reductions were made in various fields such as fuel, tra-nsportation, allowances and lab-

our wages. In 1984, labour wages reached up to JD 627,000, while in 1985 this amount was reduced to JD 600,000, leaving the ministry with a deficit of JD 27,000 to work on.

### Cutting expenses

"We are trying to cut on expenses in all fields where we have a lot of unnecessary spending as a result of irresponsible actions pray cticed by irresponsible people at the ministry." Mr. Bashir said. The ministry, as part of its new policy, started reevaluating many administrative matters and new sections were introduced in the ministry such as a new marketing directorate, a new agricultural information office and a new post lor a general inspector. The geninspector," the minister said. will inspect all agricultural dir-ectorates and sectors all over for-

these areas.
The Ministry of Agriculture in Jordan is trying hard to organise all agricultural sectors, to set pri-orities, to hire qualified engineers and veterinarians, to modernise many of its techniques and to present the proper advice and sup-ervision to the farmers and the private sector, Mr. Bashir said.

The ministry will reorganise laboratories, encourage veterinations to open their private clinics under the supervision of the ministry, encourage the private sector use vaccinations and try to solve the problems facing per-sonnel, labourers and admmistrators at the ministry as well as the problems facing the farmers by presenting the proper technical advice to them," the minister said.

There are around 314 illnerate people at the ministry who are working as ambulants and whose health conditions do not help them to work efficiently. The-refore, these people will be replaced with young people who can read and write," he added.

### New measures

The minister outlined many other measures to be taken, such as handling over projects to the private sector. "The fish project in Azrak will be handed over to the private sector, but will be subject to the ministry's supervision," he

The new economy procedures taken at the ministry, include merging the cow station in Deir Alla with the Jordanian Econom Social Organisation for Repred | Servicemen, Al Jater project will be handed over to a cooperative society and the water project there is be given to the Water Authority of Jordan. The development of the Zarqa River basin will become part of the responsibility of the directorate of forestry and soil conservation in order to save expenses and machinery and the scientitic research centre will be moved to new premises in Baqa'a and the old building will be given back to the University of Jordan. Also, the ministry will reopen the three maintenance workshops for the purpose of fixing and doing proper maintenance on cars and machinery belonging to the min-istry and this will save large amounts that are paid for maintenance

every year, he said. The minister called on all the ectorates and sectors all over for-dan to assess the achievements in crimarians and directors to be

more responsible and to help as much as they can in implementing their tasks, according to the ne-policy of the ministry, in order t avoid any unnecessary spending and to be efficient in their fields, to set priorities in accordance with available requirements and potentials of the ministry.

"We have around 70 unlicensed poultry farmers which were established and started operation without the Ministry of Agriculture's knowledge, the minister said. What we need is the efficiency at work and conperation between the various sec-tors and directorate at the minhe added

The minister went on to explain problems facing the sheep industry in Jordan because of the low amount of rainfall this year. As a result the ministry took the same procedure taken last year where exportation of sheep was allowed under all conditions.

Also speaking at the meeting was Dr. Salem Al Lawzi, under secretary of the Ministry of Agr-iculture, who praised this huge gathering at the ministry, the first of its kind. Dr. Al Lawzi hig-hlighted the importance of the agr-icultural sector and the continuous support this sector is getting from the government. The gov-ernment has donated JD 7 million to the Ministry of Agriculture which is the concerned sector for supporting the agricultural pro-duction," he said.

### Wheat, apples

Dr. Al Lawzi highlighted the wheat project in Alswan area where around 15,000 dunums will be cultivated with wheat and the apple project which has been supported by the government and which is to be implemented in south of Jordan.

"A new slaughter house for poultry will be established in Duleil area with a capacity of 5,000 tonnes per hour, we hope that by the year 1990, all the problems of poultry slaughtering will be solved," Dr. Al Lawzi said, "The ministry will also expand its irrigation services in the Jordan Valley and many other areas where trigation is needed, as the case in northern Ghor," he added, Dr. Al I aw t also pointed out the role of the agricultural credit institution which contributed JD 8 million to Arar approves committee's recommendations
