The U.S. Government has viewed with sympathy the efforts directed to find a solution for the difficulties which have arisen in connection with the construction of the B'noth Iacob canal by Israel.

It notes that in the absence of agreement on certain points at issue between the U.N. Chief of Staff and the Government of Israel it was agreed that the matter might be pursued in the Security Council.

The Council has this problem now inserted on its agenda and is about to enter into a detailed discussion of the case. The U.S. Government will approach these discussions in an open mind and in the hope that after examination of the facts and claims the points at issue will be clarified and the matter satisfactorily settled.

3. The Recurity Council's urgent examination of the question terminated on 22 January 1994, when no substantive resolution was adopted owing to the negative vote of a permanent member.

adopted the following decision:

The Covernment of larged notes that the conclusion of the Security Council's consideration of the subject without any decisions having been arrived at, signifies the facture of Syria's complaint against larged which had caused the Security Council to be seized of the problem.

The same decision continued that the exessination referred to in the doverment's undertaking of 27 ctober 1953 had also terminated. That decision was made public. Syria took no steps to dispute the interpretation there given to the effect of the discussion in the Security Council; minilarly, a Government represented on the Security Council and no organ of the United Nations evinced ony resotion. A the contrary, steps were taken under United Mations adspices to reach satisfactory solution of the outstrading questions involving private rights. For that purpose a mission of two experts was sent to the sice and code recommendations for the necessory technical procugates. On 26 Ferch 1954 the Government of Israel informed the Chief of Starf, Willed, of its acceptance of those recommendations.
