Jerusalem, 12 October 1953.

Dear Mr. Hinister.

I have the honour to addnowledge receipt of your letter FA/796/53, dated 11 October, suggesting that we should hold at my earliest convenience the further meeting foreseen in the joint communique of 28 September.

The contemplated meeting has been delayed owing to my other responsibilities, and also because I wanted to have information on one of the very first points I had raised; vis., Did Israeli engineers start their work in connection with the canel project on trab-owned land? You are moreover awars that the record of our 28 September meeting was not sent to me by your office until 5 October That report was recement to avoid misunderstandings on the views you had express I

The situation or I see it totay is as follows: the investigation of land titles in the Land Registry Office in Sefad has proved that work in connection with the conal evolect was started in deptember on Arab land, without the consent of the owners. This has taken place, notwithstanding the "categorical essurances" by Israeli representatives, to which Four Axcelluncy has referred in your letter of 24 September 1953 (paragraph 7 a). Actual facts have contradicted the assurances "that the stolect has not so for involved, nor will it involve to the future, the use of Arab-owned land in the Comilitarized Zone, and that it has not otherwise affected, nor will it in the future affect such land."

This contradiction between "categorical assurances" and reality provides, in my opinion, a powerful argument for the asceptance by the lersel forcement of the measure indicated in paragraph 7 of my letter dated 26 Jeptember 1953. Your excellency will remember that, on the basis of a statement contained in paragraph 9 of your letter of 24 September, I suggested that the Covernment of Tersel should instruct the responsible authority to cease working in the Demilitarised Rome, in order to facilitate the clarification of most points which you had proposed, as well as the examination by the Security Council of the issue which your flovernment was also, if necessary, reads submit to it. This auggestion has been "noted" in your lutter FA/791/53, dated 27 Beptember, but has not up to now been answered.

I am at your disposal for a meeting on the 13th or 15th, if either of those dates is convenient to you.
