## TRUCE SUPERVISION ORGANIZATION

Jerusalem, 8 September, 1953

Dear Dr. Eytan,

I am communicating to you a copy of an urgent letter I am sending to Colonel Shalev.

I had hoped that, during my absence from the Middle East, the obstacle which, since the end of May, had prevented a resumption of the Israel-Syrian talks would be removed. Such is, however, not the case, and the end of the tension resulting from conflicting views on the question of legitimate or illegitimate activities in the Demilitarized Zone is not in sight.

V of the Armistice Agreement and Dr. Bunche's authoritative comment remain in force, the powers of the hairman with regard to the Demilitarized Zone must be dischraged. He cannot discharge them unless he is informed sufficiently in advance of any proposed action and is given an opportunity to study it and ti form his considered opinion.

You will accordingly appreciate why in the present circumstances I am urging that working on the proposed damming of the western channek of the Jordan be stopped and that I should receive full information on the proposed new irrigation project.
