Jews still in Ethiopia could be 're-settled'

BONN. - The Jewish community still in Ethiopia might be forcibly dispersed and perish as a result, international sources following developments in Ethiopia said here recently.

The sources told *The Jerusalem Post* that the Ethiopian authorities are likely to use their population resettlement policy to "solve" the Jewish problem too. The Ethiopian government is carrying out a prog-

ramme to resettle one million of its citizens. An estimated 200,000 - 300,000 are said to have already been resettled.

As part of the programme, it would be easy for Addis Ababa to deport Jews from their villages and disperse them throughout the country, thus ending their communal life. The consequence would probably be assimilation of the Jews, the sources said.
