

Hirano Jinja, Yamashiro Province. Kyoto.

There are four shrine buildings in the shrine enclosure and each shrine has four different kami installed.

In main shrine:

1--Ameno mimaka nushi no kami.

2--Takami Musubi no kami

3--Kamu Musubi no kami

- 4--Umashi ashi kahi hiko ^{gi} no kami.

Sometimes these four kami are jointly known by the name of Imaki okami

In 2nd shrine:

1--Ameno no toko tachi no kami.

2--Kuni no toko ^{chi} tachi no kami

3--Toyo kuni nushi no kami

4--O tomowa-ke no mikoto

The last Kami is (These are the same kami who are in Iwashimiszu Hachimangu) *is installed* They are jointly known by the name of Kuō no okami. The first shrine was originally located at Mt. Imaki, so the kami in Main shrine are called Imaki okami. The second shrine was originally located in Kuō Village so these kami are called Kuō no okami.

In 3rd Shrine:

1--Uhi ⁱ no kami

2--Tsunekuki ^{nu hi} no kami

3--Ohotonoji no kami

4--Osasagi no mikoto.

These four kami are known by the name of Furuaki okami or Furuseki okami.

- 3--Kamu Murobi no kami
- 4--Umeshi saki kahi hiko ^{is} no kami.

Sometimes these four kami are jointly known by the name of Imaki okami

In 2nd shrine:

- 1--Ameno no toki tachi no kami.
- 2--Kuni no toki tachi ^{chi} no kami
- 3--Toyo kuni nashi no kami

4--O tomowa-ke no mikoto

These are the same kami who are in Iwashimizu Hachimangu

- 3--Otononji no kami
- 4--Oasagi no mikoto.

These four kami are jointly known as Hirume okami because the shrine was originally located by Hirume mountain.

All these kami have wonderful virtue. Everything that grows on earth and everything connected with human life is in some way dependent upon these kami. All human beings and all animals are under their protection. All forests, and fields and all agriculture are included as well as the control of fire, water, sickness, military work, commerce and in fact every activity of human life.

These kami are recognized as the patron kami of all ^{the families} ~~other~~ kami in the City of Kyoto, and if worshipped will grant every human wish.

This shrine was once very prominent though it has been somewhat neglected for many years. Even the ^{very} name of the kami ^{became} ~~were~~ unknown for some time, but when the shrine was raised to first rank the ^{of the Kami installed in the four shrines} proper names were found through a careful search of all historical material.
