

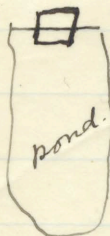

## THE MIYAKO HOTEL, KYOTO.

The woods in front of the shrine are called  
Tadasu-no-mori - or the Mori woods.

KYOTO,

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Tadasu-no-<sup>at</sup>edo or well of Tadasu.  
Over the well is a small shrine  
named Mitarashi-no-yoshiro  
mi = august; tā (or tā) = hand  
arashi (or arou) = to wash - i.e. hand washing  
well.

Every shrine has either a well or

Before entering the shrine precincts  
everyone should wash hands & mouth  
ded. to Sheorissū-hime-no-mikoto  
the goddess of water -

In front of this shrine the Nagoshi-  
no-harai is observed on 1<sup>st</sup> Day of  
the Bull in July.

[this deity also called Ona-muchi-no-mikoto: O = great; na = name, muchi = possessing. i.e. deity with a great name]

2 Ashihara Shiko

Ashi = reed; hara = plain. ashihara = reed plain. abbreviation of old name

of Japan. shiko = ugly. O = male  
 i.e. ugly male deity of Japan

3 Yachi-hoko

Ya = 8; chi = 1000; hoko = halberd.  
 i.e. deity of the 8000 halberds. That is expressing his character as war deity

4 Omono-nushi

O = great; mono = thing; nushi = master  
 i.e. The deity master of great things

5 Otoni-nushi

O = great; toni = country; nushi = master, or Deity master of the country

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6. Okenni-tama-wo-mikoto

O = great; kenni = country; tama = spirit. When the spirit of this deity rules the country it is called Okenni-tama-wo-mikoto

From the Omur period the fest. ceased to take place but 17<sup>th</sup> year of Genroku of Temp. Higashi-yama this fest. was revived & has since been observed up to the present day.

As written by the message presented by Imp. envoy, the welfare of officials & people are prayed for. This fest. is aimed to pray for the happiness & prosperity of the people.

June 30 - Dec. 31 - Ocharai, a great purification. This service is fixed as a Kōsaijari or ordinary annual ceremony.

The local governor is present & the order of ceremony is observed according to the regulations in the 3<sup>rd</sup> yr. of Tai Shō - 1914.

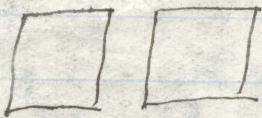

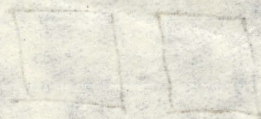

or 4 direction worship is observed.  
also in all households of Shinto  
believers -

Ever since reign of Emp. Uda rice-gruel of red & white has been offered to the deities in order to expell evil influences, or evil atmosphere throughout the year. The same ceremony is performed for the same purpose at this shrine - for the safety of the people -

Feb. 11<sup>th</sup> - Kigen-setsu-sai - (Chū-sai or middle-class fest.)  
As this day falls on anniversary of accession of Emp. Jimmu at Keshiwabara - S.W. of Mt. Unebi in Yamato prov. & this day is set aside as national holiday - with prayers at the shrines - at this shrine ~~with~~ praising the lofty virtues of 1<sup>st</sup> Emperor.

Feb. 17<sup>th</sup> - Kinen-sai (tōi-sai or grand fest.)  
at Ise - especial Imp. envoy is sent. Impressive fest. at S. G.

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At the time Niinigi no mikoto, the  
grand child of Amaterasu-omikami  
was sent to govern the country, the  
Sacred mirror, sword, & jewel, &  
a sheath of rice were given to him  
instructing him to pay especial  
attention to the growing of rice - &  
he paid especial attention to the  
growth of rice - as upon it depended  
the strength of the country. The fact  
that rice is grown is to be attributed  
to Amaterasu omikami - & so the  
Kinensai has been observed by  
successive emperors - in order to  
preserve prosperity of country & well  
fare of nation.

March. - Spring Equinox - *Shunki-korai*

main shrine. As Komo Matsuri is  
observed on May 15<sup>th</sup> the spirits of these  
deities are especially invited to this  
fest. in order to participate in the  
festival. This fest. originally a  
ground fest. was discontinued <sup>from reign of Emp. Gokashimabara</sup> fr. 1518  
1501  
to 1528. Restored in 7 yr. of Genroku  
at the same time with the restoration  
of the Aoi fest. 1694. Special donation  
from Imp. Court; made for purchase.
