

USHI-TENJIN-YAMA, also called
TENJIN YAMA.

This float represents the Kitano Tenjin shrine. It is dedicated to the god of Literature and Calligraphy, Sugawara Michizane, who lived in the latter half of the 9th Century. He established a system of national education, and rose to the position of second minister of State but the jealousy of a rival caused him to be banished. He died in exile on the Island of Kyushu.

The plum tree has historical associations with this god. The pine tree symbolizes the everlasting life. In this case the everlasting life and fame of Suzawara Michizane, the god of literature and Calligraphy.
