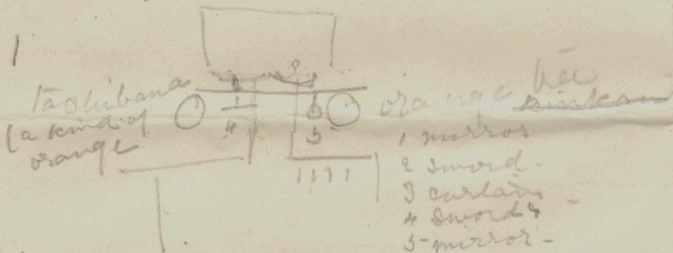

Anniversary of Jingo Koji's death
 1560 years ago -
 Spring fest. April 15th asked for
 norito.
 Seeds for us in seeds.



- 1 food - 2 norito read
- 3 Sekoki branch - offered by gujo
- 4 the 6 priests' worship
- 5 - removal of food.

In take, off food & go up steps
 the priests go on right side of steps
 from not middle or left side
 The priests in colored
 gowns take trays to curtain
 those of lower rank to white

Hoyo-ai - a festival when living
 things were liberated - a Buddhist
 fest. now changed to Rei - Sei
 Sept. 15th

The fest. of this Shrine all they
 all dated by new calendar & no
 longer old calendar - 1 exception
 Chu-ai Tenno - anniversary of his
 death. 1st "Day of Hare" in Feb.

The gujo of Izayagi - gujo
 Mr Murata Masao

take them from there - i.e. from this
 side of the curtain

Interview after services
 no equivalent in English for
 gujo - better call it gujo than
 shrine
 6 volumes "Japanese ancient
 literary works" mostly dealing
 with shrines - attacked by Shogunate
 The gujo's house destroyed,
 all but library - can be
 obtained from Imp. Tokugawa
 University - Department
 compilation of Japanese
