The Temple of Benzaiten in Gotokeuin.

The idol was carved by the priest Kobo, the founder of the Shingon sect of Buddhism in Japan, about 1050 years ago. It was formerly in the temple of Sugiyama, in the Province of Idzumi. In 1180, when Yoritomo, the first Shogun, raised his army in Idzumi to avenge his father upon the Taira family, he prayed to Benzaiten on Sugiyama for victory. After he became Shogun, he erected a temple in Yokohama and brought to it the idol of Benzaiten from Sugiyama. All the succeeding Shoguns followed his example in revering the deity. The temple of Yokohama was on an island where the railway station now stands. In 1869 it was removed to the grounds of Gotokeuin. It is called Sugiyama Benzaiten.

The Bell of Gotokeuin is very interesting as it was made from metallic mirrors. When a Japanese maiden marries, she brings with her to the bridegroom's house a metallic mirror, which, when she dies is presented to the temple in which the funeral service is celebrated. The temple after having collected a sufficient number of mirrors, founds a bell. The bell, when rung, or rather struck announces at the first stroke, "All things are changeable," at the second stroke "This is the law of births and death," at the third stroke, "There is a state attainable, in which births and deaths are at an end, and at the fourth stroke, "In this state above the changes you shall find the true beauty." The Japanese syllabary, commonly called I-Ro-Ha, the present form of which was composed by the priest Kobo, is really a poem expressing the same idea in the following terms: Iro wa misedo chirinuru wo, (Though the flowers bloom beautifully, they shall fade and be dispersed.) Waga yo tarego toume naran, (In this world of ours, who can believe himself permanent?) Ue no oku yama kyo koete. (To-day I cross over the remotest mountain



The Temple of Benigata in Potomac.

The edifice was erected in the year 1800, the founder of the Benigata sect of Buddhism in Japan, about 1070 years ago. It was founded in the temple of Benigata, in the Province of Sagami. increased every time it is struck. Gotoxuin is presided over
by a bishop who lives in the main temple, if the visitors from the
