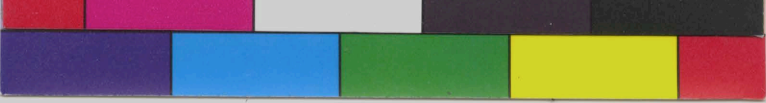
My dear Mr. Tsukamoto:
