Dear Campbell,

I am sending you enclosed two letters, one to Mr. Barnes, Game Warden of Klamath Falls, and the other to Dan Godsil of Lakeview. You can either mail or present these letters and I am sure the men will help you in any way they can.

I think perhaps you will get the shooting you want at Klamath Falls and in the surrounding country. If the conditions are right you might enjoy going on over to Lakeview, but unless you can go on into Warner Valley, about 40 miles beyond Lakeview, you may not get as good duck shooting as around Klamath country. If you should go over into Warner Valley be sure and look up Merial Jacobs, who lives ten miles from Adel, at the head of Warner Valley. He is the man we were out with for antelope and is employed as a Federal hunter. He will be glad to go out with you.

At Klamath Falls the boys used to get some fine shooting on to the south-east, beyond Merrill, in the Tule Lake country. This, however, is in northern California.

I am sending you under separate cover a bunch of lecture leaflets. If you can get these into the hands of any of your friends in the east I am sure it will help. I lecture at the Field Museum in Chicago Saturday, January 14th and Sunday the 15th. I mention this in case you happen to know of anyone who would be interested in seeing the reels. Should like very much to get in touch with John Borden at Chicago.
