In four weeks I have lost one pound: I understand better what to eat now than I did at first - so that I expect results more quickly. It is not so easy to put off one's flesh when for practical purposes you take no exercise.

Sam has had a sinus operation at the Phillips House at the Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. He has come out of it very nicely, I am most thankful to say.
