My dear Gertrude:

Some time ago I received a brief dated January 25, 1933, from Mr. E. R. Bryson, regarding your previous returns for State Income Tax in Oregon and, on February 10th, I wrote to him giving him my views as formed by consultation with very good lawyers here in Chicago with reference to one's domicile. As I did not hear from him, I wired him on the 20th instant as follows:

"Did you receive my letter of the tenth instant If so have you and Mrs. Warner come to any conclusion regarding her domicile also where she wishes me to file her Nineteen Thirty Two Federal income tax return and any other income or personal property return for Thirty Two",

to which I got a prompt reply by wire on the 22nd, as follows:

"In consultation Friday last Mrs. Warner definitely decided that Oregon was her home and she will file returns from here stop Decision conforms with Sam's advice that her residence should be selected without regard to effect on taxation."

I do not know when any returns should be filed for 1932 Income Tax returns in Oregon and so far I have not received any blanks.

I think it would be best for me to make out a statement of all your income from various sources and send it to you so that you can get Mr. Bryson to make out the return for you in conformity with any agreements he may have made with the State Tax Commission of Oregon in his former adjustments. I have not yet received any detailed statement from Mr. Edmonds regarding your income through the Bass Trust but I am assured that I will have this information tomorrow and, as ~~as~~ soon as all the information can be gotten together, I will send it to you.

It seems to me that it would be best, so far as record is concerned, if you would send me the date of the payment of the \$1,000.00 which you paid on back income tax through Mr. Bryson, and also the receipt which you will probably have for such payment, in order that I may file it in your files with me.
