My dear Gertrude:

I have just received your letter of the 13th instant and I will attend to having \$1,000.00 transferred from your Continental Illinois National Bank and Trust Company account to your Northern Trust Company account promptly.

In regard to your question regarding your Federal income tax, you will remember that you asked me to send all the information regarding your income which I had here to Mr. E. R. Bryson at Eugene as he was going to make up your 1933 return. I sent the information to Mr. Bryson and I have no information here as to the amount of your income tax shown by this schedule and, while I since suggested that it would be a good idea to have a copy of this return in your files in my office along with copies of your previous returns, I have not received such a copy.

If your tax was not paid in full on March 15th, you elected to pay quarterly and these quarterly payments would be due on June 15th, September 15th, and December 15th.

I did write you on July 9th that there was an additional tax of \$305.55 plus a small interest charge due on your 1932 Federal income tax return, arising out of a controversey between the government and Mr. Edmonds in connection with the Clara F. Bass Trust and which Mr. Edmonds has indicated to me should be paid, and I have O K'd a Waiver to the Revenue Agent here in Chicago. A bill for this amount may come to me any time now. We are all as usual at home.
