Dear Cousin

When I received Mr. Edmonds' letter enclosing yours and Cousin Roberts' kind remittance it brought to mind what your father did for mine and later for each of us children between fifty and sixty years ago and one would think that with that start and the experiences that had been ours that we should not have needed assistance now but we are grateful both for your father's and for your kindness.

Upon inquiry I find that our financial prospects are not as favorable as I supposed even sixty days ago for the near future and with Mr. Tinkler's salary cut more than $\frac{1}{4}$, by time off, and one boy in High School and one in the lower grades - and our own prospects - your kindness will add much to our physical and mental comfort for the winter & Brother John requires the constant readiness to attend on him both day and night and sometimes is unable to talk so that we can understand him but so far seems to understand us and to indicate yes or no to our questions and so far I have been able to do what is necessary for him for which I am grateful though sometimes he has shown indications of becoming at times unmanageable without the use

of physical effort - he is able to walk as much as a mile and one half daily though we do not intend to permit him out of the yard alone & he is sometimes better than others & This is mostly a duplicate of mine to cousin Robert and I thought it due you that write to each of you something of Johns children - John Falet drives near us here with his present wife parents in and unpaid for home and though married two years ago has not had steady employment during that time though he supposed he had when ^{he} married but lost out to the employer's relatives & he all like his wife & The father in law finds little to do these times & Walter lives in Berkeley Calif. has two girls in grade schools and one in high school and are paying out on a home, his wife is with the telephone company, Walter drives for a Taxi Company but has been out of employment some the last I knew & either would help what they could were it badly needed & Johns daughter Ruth and husband Dr. C. R. Mawley who are home from India on furlough and their children Tracy, who is starting his third year in College and Charles Jr. in Junior High and Ruth in the lower grade, about the 6th. are, for the winter located at 32 Kenwood Ave Newton Center Mass. Ruth and Dr. travel some in the interests of the Baptist Board of Foreign Missions this winter they have offered to help us and tried to arrange with John & Walter but there I supposed we could get along.

John, at their Express, and I were with them in
Redlands Calif two years ago and they helped some
last winter - They wished ^{us to come} them to come to Redlands
again last winter but it did not seem to me advisable
on account of cost of Transportation & While we cannot
recompence Ellen and Oscar for the inconveniences
we hope to do so for the actual Extra cash outlay
on our account and yet we are accepting help
from you and cousin Robert and if under the
circumstances it does not seem the right thing to
you you should discontinue the help and we
will still be grateful to you [&] proud that you have
thought of us in such times, that is, that we have
such ^{kind} relatives & I had enough over due on a land
Contract that I thought would come in as needed
but now I fear it will not or is not to be depended on &

to you and our gladness that you are
in a position that you can do these things
