Koopman Century Farm

Fredrick (Fritz) and Minnie Reiling Koopman were born in Germany. Fritz immigrated to the United States in 1867 when he was 27 years old. Minnie came to America as a child. They met, married and lived in Kansas for 10 years before the trip west to settle in the Pine Valley in 1883.

Fritz brought his wife and seven children across the Oregon Trail in a covered wagon. They lived in the very first house made of lumber in Pine Valley. The house is still standing today. Mr. Koopman homesteaded his place in 1884. He received his Land Patent in 1891, signed by President Benjamin Harrison.

The property is now owned by Stan Gulick and Grace Gulick, the widow of Charles Gulick, Jr. Both Stan and Charles were great-grandsons of Fritz Koopman.
