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**Century Farm
Being Razed
For New Home**

The pioneer Savage home, a landmark for more than a hundred years in the Victor Point district, is being razed completely to make way for a new home.

The old home, built in 1856 on a donation land claim, has been in the Savage family for the entire time and the family has received a 'Century Farm' award.

The old place was badly damaged in the Columbus Day storm and Wayne Savage is having a new home built.

The old place, which had been remodeled and enlarged several times, stood on a hill back from the highway. It had a view of the farm land, the Cascade foothills to the east and as far as the Coast Range on the west.
