My Grandfather crossed the plains with his family in 1847. In 1851
he married Elizabeth Nancy Smith. He owned the first store and operated
the first Post Office in the Waldo Hills. This Post Office and store was
called Whitaker and years after the store was no longer doing business
or the Post Office operating. It was still known as Whitaker and it hasn't
(over)

been many years since it was not on the road signs.

My father Jephtha T. Hunt was Judge of Marion County from 1924 to 1928 when he was forced to resign due to his health. As a farmer he raised grain and Registered Durham Stock and Shropshire Sheep. Both my Grandfather, Grandmother and Father were exhibitors for many years at the Oregon State Fair. My father was a member of the Old Agricultural Society and was presented a life membership to the Oregon State Fair Association
