to *him* paid, has bargained and sold, and by these presents does bargain, sell and quit-claim unto *A. O. Anderson* of *same place* the following described premises, to-wit:

One W 1/2 SW 1/4 & SE 1/4 of NW 1/4 S. 31. T. 7. S. R. 39. E. W. M. containing 114 acres more or less in Wasco County State of Oregon.

This deed is executed for the purpose of taking the place of a certain deed of the above described property, made & executed on or about Nov. 10th 1883. by the grantor herein to said above grantee & which said deed was subsequently destroyed by fire at the time of the burning of the Wasco County Court house in 1885.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises, with their appurtenances, unto the said *A. O. Anderson* heirs and assigns forever.

S. 31. T. 7. S. 12. E. E. containing one
Hundred and fourteen & 5/100 acres Situate
in Baker County Oregon

To have and to hold the said premises, unto the said Register, or his successors in office
forever. This conveyance is intended as a Mortgage to secure payment of the two
several promissory notes of which the following are copies, to-wit:

Now if the said William A Owen shall pay
said notes according to the tenor thereof, when the same shall become due, then this convey-
ance shall be null and void; but if he shall fail so to pay the same, then he shall forfeit all
right, title and interest in and to said lands, and the same shall revert to the State of Ore-
gon absolutely, as provided by law.

OREGON CENTURY FARM AWARDS 1990

The ANDERSON ranch near Haines has been in the family since 1883. The present owner, David Anderson is the great grandson of the original owner, Frank Anderson and the crops raised are much the same as they were then.

The ELLIOTT ranch was filed for in 1882 and finally deeded to Sebird Wilson, grandfather of Harry Elliott in 1885 and has been in continuous ownership by the family ever since.

The original owner of the BAUMEISTER farm, J.B. MURRAY was a distinguished pioneer and employee of the Hudson's Bay Company in Canada before he moved to the Unity area. He gained ownership of his ranch in 1881 and is the great, great grandfather of Rowena Baumeister.

The grandfather of GIFFORD PARKER, was the original owner of the PARKER ranch which is located in North Powder and has been in the family since 1888. It is being honored in Baker County because this is the business center for Mr. Parker.

BAKER COUNTY HISTORIC LANDS

The CROW land is located on Crow Lane in the Halfway area. There is still an old woodshed left from the original buildings. Today, Mrs. Juanita Crow lives on the land.

Susan Skelton-Fleming is the present owner of the property known in Baker City as the Nash house but originally owned by John Geiser. She is the great, great granddaughter of John Geiser.
