ALASKA BROWN BEAR REFUGE

The larger part of Admiralty Island in southeastern Alaska has been set aside as a sanctuary for the biggest bears that live. The island has a total area of 1,065,000 acres and is a part of the Tongass National Forest.

As this is the most accessible and advantageous place to study and photograph these big animals, a system of trails, shelter cabins and observation blinds will be constructed for the benefit of naturalists and tourists.

In addition to the bears, Admiralty Island has an abundance of other wild life resources. The small Sitka deer is numerous, also beaver, mink, otter and marten. Many migratory water fowl live here. The streams and lakes afford excellent trout fishing.
