## DOLLY VARDEN TROUT

The Dolly Varden trout or charr is one of the most voracious fish in Oregon waters. Mr. Harry H. Stage of the United States Bureau of Entomology says he caught a large Dolly Varden trout in the Metolius River and upon examination found it had a chipmunk in its stomach. The fish is commonly known as bull trout and inhabits the country from the Sacramento basin north and east to Montana and on to the Aleutian Chain of islands.

Because of its cannibalistic tendencies, preying on the fingerlings of trout and salmon, this species is not permitted to be propagated in the state of Oregon. On the other hand, its cousin, the eastern brook trout, and the Loch Leven trout have been liberated in many streams of the state by the State Game Commission.
