In 1911, when Mr. Roosevelt. tour-ing the country, arrived at the Fort-land hotel, he changed his usual hard-and-fast rule of allowing no one to see him during his rest period and spent a good part of the afternoon with Dr. Finley looking at his pic-tures and discussing matters of wild life conservation.
