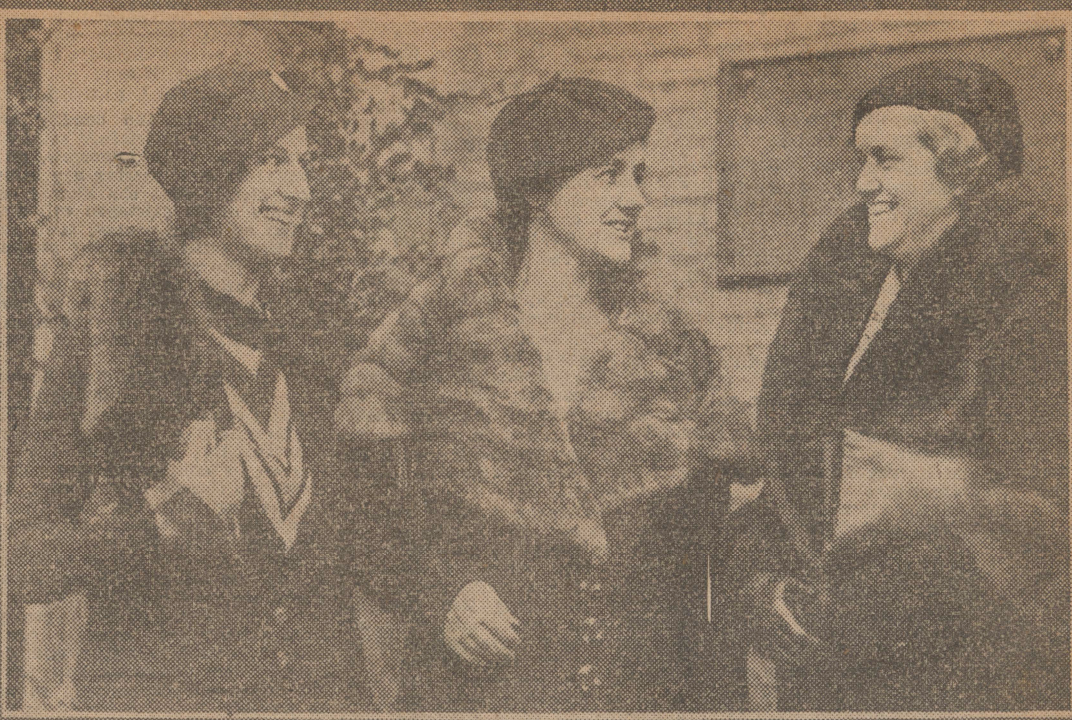

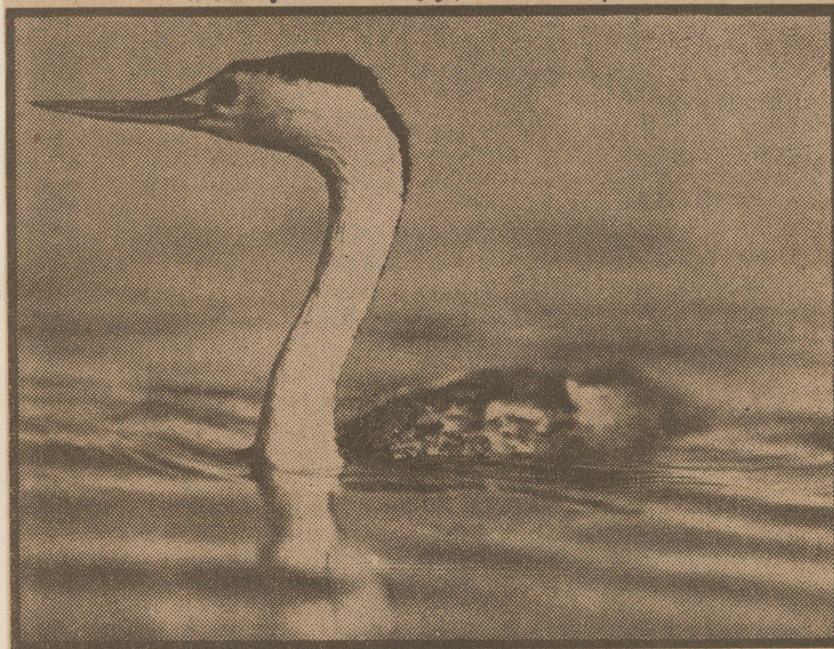

He is found in various Oregon lakes and marshes, where he was threatened with extermination until federal laws protected him two-score years ago. His heavy plumage was much desired for hats and capes of proud ladies. About the size of the pin-tail duck, this grebe is a big brother of the common hell-diver.
