Mr. Finley is the author of AMERICAN BIRDS published by Charles Scribner's Sons, and joint author with Mrs. Finley of LITTLE BIRD BLUE, published by Houghton, Mifflin and Company, and WILD ANIMAL PETS, published by Scribners.

The AMERICAN MAGAZINE has described Finley as "one of the most extraordinary Naturalists living." He has photographed everything that runs, flies or swims in his home State of Oregon... and has cruised, motored and packed from Texas coast up thru the great desert regions to the Canadian border and Alaska. Years afield have resulted in a collection of nearly 20,000 still photographs and several hundred thousand feet of motion pictures of outdoor subjects, which is one of the most unique and complete natural history records ever made.

For over 25 years, William Finley, accompanied by his wife, has cruised and camped from tide line to mountain top, trekking thru little known parts of the desert, and packing into the wildest corners of all the western mountain ranges.

For twenty years he served as President of the Oregon Audubon Society, and during this time was field agent for the National Association of Audubon Societies for the Pacific Coast. He is field naturalist and conservation director for the American Nature Association, and with Arthur Newton Pack, its President, has carried on a number of expeditions for the purpose of collecting educational material on bird and animal life in various parts of the country.

J. N. (Ding) Darling, famed cartoonist and former Chief of the U. S. Biological, declares Finley is the most effective dramatizer of North American Wildlife in the country.

Each winter Finley takes the out-of-doors to many organizations, Schools, Colleges, Women's Clubs, boy and girl scouts and scientific organizations in cities thruout the land. He comes to Glen Ellyn under the sponsorship of the DuPage Chapter of the Izaak Walton League, direct from an engagement at the Carnegie Museum in Pittsburgh, and from lectures in Toronto, Canada before the Royal Canadian Institute and McGill University at Montreal.
