

For Children So That They May Grow

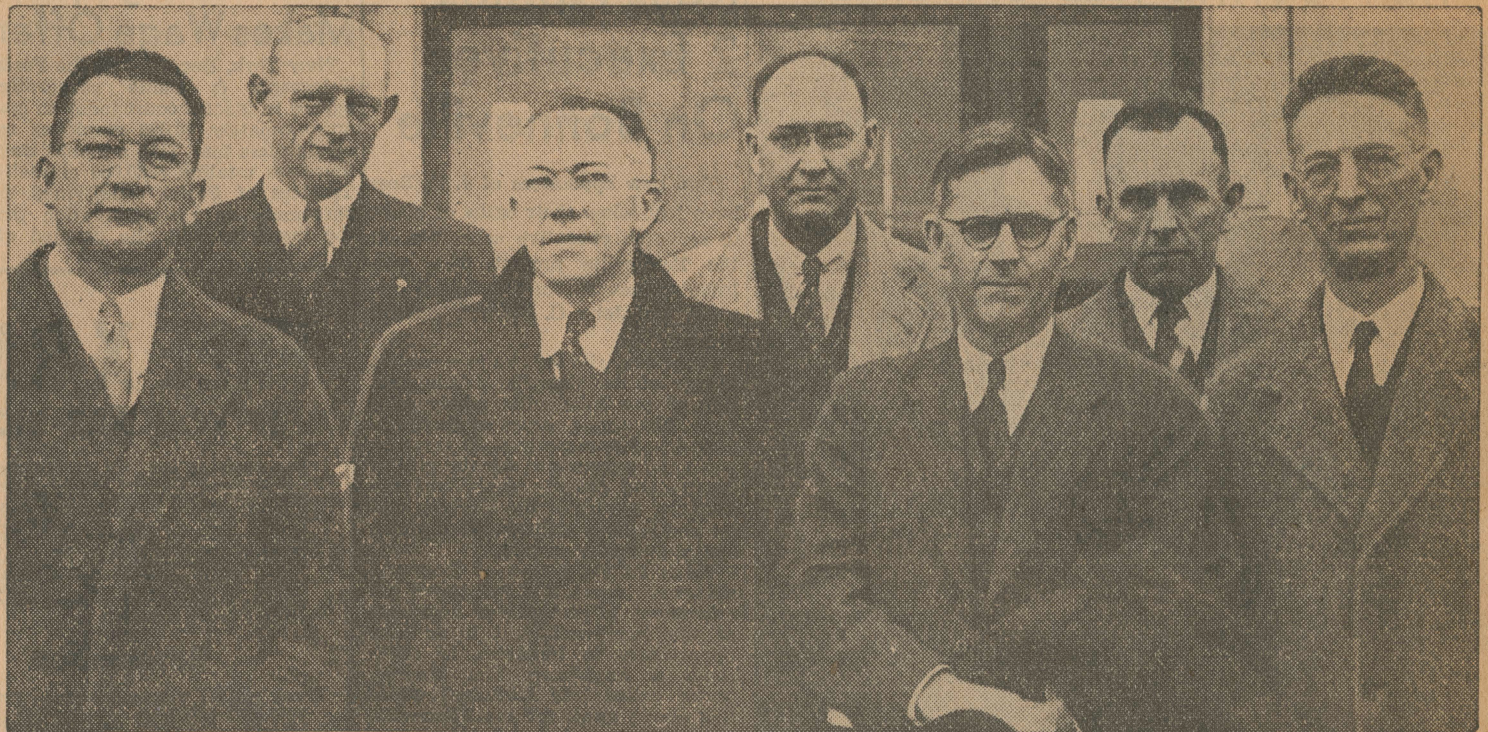
