## Wildlife Federation Sessions Start Friday

The annual session of the Oregon Wildlife federation will begin with registration Friday morning at 8:30 o'clock on the college campus. President George W. Peavy will welcome wildlife conservationists at the opening session at 9:30 o'clock.

Talks and discussions on stream pollution, roadside beautification, the native oyster in Oregon and upland game birds in the Willamette valley will be included in Friday morning's program.

A discussion of the dams on the Willamette river and probable effect on wildlife will be given Friday afternoon by H. A. Rands, U. S. army engineer representing the Willamette valley basin commission; C. D. Stringer, ex-senator, and William L. Finley, vice president of the American Wildlife federation.


Talks at the banquet Friday night will be given by Paul Needham, U. S. associate aquatic biologist of the bureau of fisheries; Dr. Frederick M. Hunter, chancellor of the state board of higher education, and Dr. Finley.

The final session Saturday afternoon will include talks by William Smith, president of the Oregon wildlife federation, and Dr. Finley. The session will close with general discussions by members of the federation.
