O. A. C. Barometer Wildlife Federation Schedules Gabrielson, Finley to Open Sessions

Principle speakers of the afternoon session of the Oregon Wildlife Federation to be held here tomorrow will be Dr. William L.

Finley, vice-president of the National Wildlife federation who will speak on dams of the Willamette river, and Dr. Ira N. Gabrielson, director of the United States fish and wildlife service, who will speak on trends of conservation and conservation problems.

Dr. Frank L. Ballard, president of Oregon State college, will deliver the address of welcome to the convention tomorrow morning after registration of the convention delegates in Memorial Union 105.

E. F. Avrill, past-president of the Oregon Wildlife federation,

will act as toastmaster at the banquet in the Memorial Union ballroom at 6:45 o'clock tomorrow night.

"Bits and Tidbits" will be the title of a speech by Leo L. Laythe, regional director of United States fish and wildlife service. Other speeches to be given during the course of the banquet are "The Responsibilities of a Wildlife Shepherd," by Ed E. Wilson, chairman of the Oregon state game commission; "History of Conservation in Oregon," by Dr. Finley and "National Conservation of Wildlife," by Dr. Gabrielson.

Color motion pictures portraying the wildlife of Oregon will complete the program.

Ira Gabrielson Heads List of Speakers at Wildlife Conference

Dr. Ira N. Gabrielson, who was well known in Oregon before he became chief of the biological survey in Washington, is coming to the state to be the principal visiting speaker at the annual Oregon Wild Life federation conference in Corvallis November 27-29. The name of the service headed by Dr. Gabrielson has been changed recently, so that he is now chief of the United States Fish and Wild Life service.

All citizens interested in wild life matters are invited to attend this year's conference, whether they represent any organization or not, says R. E. Dimick, head of the fish and game management department at Oregon State college, who is in charge of local arrangements.

William Smith, Portland, president of the federation, has arranged a program which he says will be of general interest. Among the problems listed for discussion are correction of stream pollution, the effect of flood control dams on fish life, recent advancements in wild life management, and proposed legislation affecting fish and game in this state.

The first two days of the conference will be devoted to general meetings, with the annual banquet the evening of Wednesday at which Gabrielson will speak. The final day will be devoted to committee meetings growing out of the conference.

Gabrielson will speak on trends of conservation and conservation problems. In another outstanding address of the day, Dr. William L. Finley, vice president of the national wildlife federation, will speak on dams of the Willamette river.

Sessions of the convention will be held in room 105 of the Memorial Union building.
