If however, it is impossible for Mrs. Warner to do this if she could arrange to come to New York we could appear with her before the customs officials where she can make a statement as near as she can recall, we will endeavor to have the customs officials permit us to make up a proforma invoice on this information, and after this is done, Mrs. Warner, if she can arrange to remain in the city two or three days, can be present at the examination of the articles at the Appraisers Stores. We should be pleased to have your telegraphic advice in the morning whether you will send such a list or whether Mrs. Warner prefers to see the customs officials respecting the matter.
