ALL MESSAGES TAKEN BY THIS COMPANY ARE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it repeated, that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this, beyond the accepted message rate is charged in addition. Unless otherwise indicated on its face, this is an accepted message and paid for as such, its consideration when it is agreed between the sender of the message and this company as follows:

1. The company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for transmission at the accepted message rate beyond the sum of five hundred dollars, nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for posted message rate beyond the sum of five hundred dollars, nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for transmission at the special message rate beyond the sum of five thousand dollars, unless expressly indicated on its face in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the working of its lines, nor for errors in cipher or obscure messages.

2. In any case where the company shall not be liable for damages for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for the non-delivery, of any message, whether caused by the negligence of its servants or otherwise, beyond the sum of five thousand dollars, at which amount each message is deemed to be valued, unless a greater value is stated in writing by the sender thereof on the face of the message, no recovery is allowed for commission, and twice the accepted message rate is paid or agreed to be paid, and an additional value equal to one-fourth of one percent of the amount by which such value is stated shall remain the property of the sender of any such message when necessary to reach its destination.

3. The company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward the message over the lines of any other company when necessary to reach its destination.

4. Domestic messages and incoming cable messages will be delivered from within certain parts of the company's office in towns of 5,000 population or less, or in any other town or village, at which service the company does not deliver, but will, without liability, at the sender's expense, as he may order, and at his expense, endeavor to contract for him for such delivery at a reasonable price.

5. No responsibility attaches to this company conveying messages until the same are accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office by one of the company's messengers, he acts for that purpose as the agent of the sender.

6. The company will not be liable for damages or statutory penalties in any case when the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the company for transmission.

7. It is agreed that in any action by the company to recover the tolls for any message or messages the proper and correct translation and delivery thereof shall be presumed, subject to rebuttal by competent evidence.

8. Special terms governing the transmission of messages according to their class, as enumerated below, shall apply to messages in each of such respective classes in addition to all the foregoing terms.

9. No employee of the company is authorized to vary the foregoing.

TELEGRAMS

A full-rate expedited service.

NIGHT MESSAGES

Accepted up to 2:00 A.M. at reduced rates to be sent during the night and delivered not earlier than the morning of the ensuing business day. Night Messages may be received at the Telegraph Company or mailed at destination to the addressee, and the Company shall be deemed to have discharged its obligation in such cases with respect to delivery by mailing each night message at destination, postage prepaid.

DAY LETTERS

A deferred day service at rates lower than the standard telegram rates as follows: One and one-half times the standard night letter rate for the transmission of 20 words or less and one-fifth of the total rates for each additional 10 words or less.

SPECIAL TERMS APPLYING TO DAY LETTERS

In further consideration of the reduced rate for this special Day Letter service, the following special terms in addition to those enumerated above are hereby agreed to:

a. Day Letters shall be forwarded by the Telegraph Company as a deferred service and the transmission and delivery of such Day Letters is, in all respects, subject to the priority of transmission and delivery of regular telegrams.

b. Day Letters shall be written in plain English. Code language is not permissible.

c. This Day Letter is received subject to the express understanding and agreement that the Company does not undertake that a Day Letter shall be delivered on the day of its date above stated, and it is agreed that the Company's obligation in this respect is subject to the condition that there shall remain sufficient time for the transmission and delivery of such Day Letter on the day of its date time for the transmission and delivery of such Day Letter on the day of its date time for the transmission and delivery of regular telegrams during regular office hours, subject to the priority of the transmission of regular telegrams under the condition named above.

No employee of the Company is authorized to vary the foregoing.

NIGHT LETTERS

Accepted up to 2:00 A.M. for delivery on the morning of the ensuing business day, at rates with lower than standard night message rates, as follows: The stand-

ard telegram rate for 10 words shall be charged for the transmission of 20 words or less, and one-half of the standard telegram rate for 30 words shall be charged for each additional 10 words or less.

SPECIAL TERMS APPLYING TO NIGHT LETTERS

In further consideration of the reduced rates for this special Night Letter service, the following special terms in addition to those enumerated above are hereby agreed to:

a. Night Letters may be at the option of the Telegraph Company be mailed at destination to the addressee, and the Company shall be deemed to have discharged its obligation in such cases with respect to delivery by mailing such Night Letters at destination, postage prepaid.

b. Night Letters shall be written in plain English. Code language is not permissible.

No employee of the Company is authorized to vary the foregoing.

FULL RATE CABLES

An expedited service throughout. Code language permitted.

DEFERRED HALF-RATE CABLES

Half-rate messages are subject to being deferred in favor of full rate messages for the following 24 hours. Must be in language of country of origin or of destination, or in French. This class of service is in effect with most European countries and with various other countries throughout the world. Full particulars supplied on application at any Western Union Office.

CABLE LETTERS

For plain-language communications. The language of the country of destination may be employed, if the Cable Letter service is in contrast to the country to be delivered at the discretion of the Company within 24 hours if telegraphic delivery is selected. Delivery by mail beyond London will be made if a full mailing address is given and the words "Pay London" are written upon the destination. Rate is approximately one-third of the full rate, minimum 10 words.

WEEK-END LETTERS

Similar to Cable Letters except that they are accepted up to midnight Saturday for delivery Monday morning, if telegraphic delivery is selected. Rate is approximately one-quarter of the full rate, minimum 10 words.
