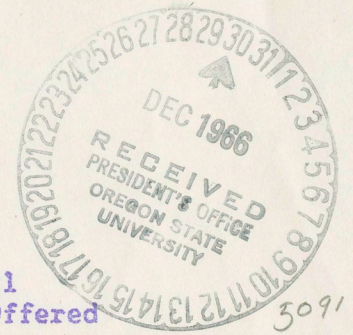

CHRONOLOGICAL HISTORY OF PSYCHOLOGY

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY



<u>Year</u>	<u>Event</u>
1872	First course with psychology in its title - Inferential Psychology - taught in the School of Moral Science. Offered for one year only.
1879 to 81 or 82	Empirical Psychology course offered in School of Moral Science.
1882 to 1888	No psychology courses offered.
1889 to 1906	Psychology required of all collegiate students in senior year. Psychology listed in the Department of Mental and Moral Philosophy. Psychology taught by President (Bloss, 1891-95; Gatch, 1896-1905)
1910-1917	Psychology offered in Department of Industrial Pedagogy (1910-14) and, later (1914-18), Industrial Education.
1918 -	Department of Psychology organized in School of Vocational Education. Both psychology and educational psychology courses offered. A three-man department by 1932 offering seven courses.
1918-1932	Department of School of Vocational Education
1932	Psychology a department in the College of Social Science, Oregon State System of Higher Education
1932-1960	Psychology a department of the Lower Division.
1939	First upper division course in psychology authorized.
1949	Fifteen hours of upper division courses carrying a small (g) authorized to bring to a total of 24 hours of such work thus permitting a graduate minor in psychology
1960-present	School of Humanities and Social Sciences authorized with psychology as one of its departments.
