## HISTORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS

The first formal courses in statistics appeared at Oregon State University during the 1919-20 academic year. In that year, Mth 103, Elements of Statistical Methods, and ES (Econ. and Soc.) 313, The Elements of Statistics, were first offered. Expansion of statistics courses continued through the next decade in a number of departments, notably Mathematics, Business Administration, Education, Economics and Sociology, Farm Crops, and Agricultural Economics, Some early instructors who are still active in the field include William Kirkham (Oregon State), Henry Scheffe (California), Paul Hoel (UCLA), and P. C. Hammer (Wisconsin).

A statistical consulting and computing service was offered in the department of Mathematics during the early 1930's but was dropped during the latter part of the depression. It was initiated again in 1946 under Dr. J. C. R. Li. A department of Statistical Service, offering consulting and computational services in the Agriculture Experiment Station, was started in 1953 and gradually expanded to serve the entire campus.

In 1956, the Department of Statistics was organized as an instructional unit in the School of Science and physically located with the Department of Statistical Service in Extension Hall. At that time most of the course work in statistics at Oregon State was consolidated in the Department of Statistics with a major program at the master's level and minor programs at the master's and doctoral level.

In 1965, a doctoral program in Statistics was added. New minors were approved in Biometry and Operations Research.

The first computer in the department, an IBM 1620, was obtained in 1961. An IBM 1410 was added in 1964 to serve the computational needs of research with the 1620 being devoted largely to instructional computing. In 1966, a campus-wide Computer Center was established and the computer facilities of the department placed within the Center.

In 1963, the name of Statistical Service was changed to the Department of Statistics (Agricultural Experiment Station) with the recognition that the separation of the two departments had been in name only. In 1966, the department moved from Extension Hall to newly remodelled quarters in Kidder Hall, formerly the old library building.

The growth of the department can be seen in the following tables, as measured by the number of students, courses, and faculty from 1957 through 1966.
